- 1) What is your full name? Andrew Mull
- 2) What is your current hometown? Blandon, PA

- 3) **What is your vocation?** I am a software developer in the Information Technology department at Kutztown University.
- 4) How many years have you been playing bagpipes?

I began playing the bagpipes in 2017 when our band was first established.

- 5) Why did you decide to play? What was your inspiration? Playing the pipes was something I always wanted to do, but back then, finding the right guidance or resources wasn't as easy as it is today with the internet. I discovered Celtic music in my late teens and early twenties. Watching Cillian Vallely play the Uilleann pipes during the original US tour of Riverdance left a profound impact on me. The haunting and beautiful sounds he produced inspired me to pursue playing pipes.
- 6) **Have you ever been to Scotland?** No, I haven't been to Scotland, but I had the opportunity to visit Ireland with my wife in 2001.
- 7) **Do you play any other instruments?** In addition to the bagpipes, I also play traditional Irish music on the fiddle.
- 8) What is your favorite pipe band tune? I don't have a single favorite tune; I'm always excited about learning the next one. However, as a band, one of the most exciting tunes we play at the moment is "Steam Train".
- 9) **Tell us about your best and/or worst piping experience.** My worst piping experience was the day I first received my Highland Pipes. I recall attempting to play them for the first time, producing an awful sound that left both me and everyone in the house wondering what I had gotten myself into. They seemed incredibly challenging, cumbersome and complex, and I had doubts about whether I could ever play them.
- 10) Is there anything else you would like to share? I'm grateful for the opportunity to spend one or more nights each week playing music with a fantastic group of individuals who share the same passion. It's a truly rewarding experience.



The Kutztown Pipe Band was awarded a 2023–2024 Special Project Grant by the Reading Musical Foundation. This grant will fund our Synergy Project. This project includes purchasing equipment needed to match concert pitch, which will allow the band to play with traditional instrumentation. This expansion will help the Kutztown Pipe Band present music in new ways to more diverse audiences.

Traditional Scottish Great Highland Bagpipes do not match the equal temperament of Western instruments. While the pitches of the drones and tonic note on the chanter are referred to as 'A', they are actually much sharper on the modern Great Highland Bagpipe. Standard frequency for A above middle C is 440 Hz. Modern pipe chanters tune between 470 and 480 Hz for low A. Because of this, the precise frequency of our notes on the chanter do not match those of a piano, guitar, or standard wind instrument.
